
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
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 - Lot chose the fertile valley and traveled east toward Sodom.
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
- Last week's lesson:
 - Abram offered Lot the pick of the territory.
 - Lot chose the fertile valley and traveled east toward Sodom.
 - Abram headed west toward Canaan and settled in land near the oaks of Mamre
- Slightly out of chronology (Focus on Abraham and Lot)
- Name change: Abraham rather than Abram (discussed next week)




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
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- Has Sodom been found?
 - Two competing candidates



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- Justice is the application of the appropriate punishment for a crime
- Other attributes of God (e.g. faithfulness, mercy, omniscience, omnipotence)
- Mercy is when you deserve a punishment for your sin, but the punishment is withheld

- However, he still treated them as distinguished guests
- Sounded like he knew it was the LORD when the promised was affirmed

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But He said, "You cannot see My face, for no man can see Me and live!" (Exodus 33:20, NASB95)

- How could Abraham see God and live?

No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten God who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained *Him*.

(John 1:18, NASB95)

Genesis 18:1-33

<u>INTERPRET</u>

Did Abraham know that true identities of the three men?

Sarah denied *it* however, saying, "I did not laugh"; for she was afraid. And He said, "No, but you did laugh." (Genesis 18:15, NASB95)

- Did the LORD know the extent of the wickedness that was going on in Sodom and Gomorrah? If so, why did He have to observe for Himself?
- God is all-knowing (omniscient). He knew the extent of the wickedness in Sodom.
- God does not act out of ignorance nor does He act recklessly

Genesis 18:1-33

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(Genesis 18:25, NASB95)

- Abraham knew the perfect justice of God
- God does not punish the righteous together with the wicked
- God will deal with sin appropriately

 - Do we fail to believe even the less extravagant promises of God?
- Abraham interceded for Sodom, asking God to spare it for the sake of the righteous.
 - Do you pray for others, even those you disagree with or might find undeserving?
 - Does rightly knowing God's character affect how we pray?





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(for by what he saw and heard that righteous man, while living among them, felt his righteous soul tormented day after day by their lawless deeds),

(2 Peter 2:8, NASB95)

- Was Lot acting righteously by offering his daughters to the men of Sodom?
- No, Lot was not acting righteously
- In fact, we know that the people of Sodom did not really take him seriously (e.g. sons-in-law v14)

Genesis 19:1-23

INTERPRET

Lot went out and spoke to his sons-in-law, who were to marry his daughters, and said, "Up, get out of this place, for the Lord will destroy the city." But he appeared to his sons-in-law to be jesting.

(Genesis 19:14, NASB95, emphasis mine)

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- No, Lot was not acting righteously
- In fact, we know that the people of Sodom did not really take him seriously (e.g. sons-in-law v14)

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Far be it from You to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous and the wicked are *treated* alike. Far be it from You! Shall not the Judge of all the earth deal justly?"

But he hesitated. So the men seized his hand and the hand of his wife and the hands of his two daughters, for the compassion of the LORD was upon him; and they brought him out, and put him outside the city.

(Genesis 19:16, NASB95, emphasis mine)

When they had brought them outside, one said, "Escape for your life! Do not look behind you, and do not stay anywhere in the valley; escape to the mountains, or you will be swept away." (Genesis 19:17, NASB95, emphasis mine)

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Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, will inherit the kingdom of God. Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God. (1 Corinthians 6:9-11, NASB95, emphasis mine)
